The Festival	<p>MakeCity Berlin is the biggest transsectoral and transdisciplinary Festival for Architecture and Urban Alternatives in Germany. After its kick off in 2015 the second edition of the festival is expecting around 20.000 visitors.</p> <p>Why transsectoral? The festival has a holistic and comprehensive approach bridging across departments, effectively addressing all areas of an intelligent, or a <i>smart city</i>. This refers to politics and administration, culture and economy, urban development and landscape planning, architecture and engineering, design and material production.</p> <p>Why transdisciplinary? The approach is best reflected in the many co-operation partners that make the festival possible and actively organize the programme: cultural institutions, architecture, urban, landscape and housing associations, civil society groups and creative people from the arts, design, photography and film.</p>

What is the festival about?	<p>Berlin Remixing Stadt neu gemischt headlines MakeCity this year. The festival emerges from the Berlin context, where real estate prices in the city centre have risen by up to 500%. Where the municipal government has set unprecedented targets for the construction of new social housing units. The integration of a newly arrived migrant population, a politically active civil society negotiating new concepts of cooperative housing, and innovative mixed-use: these current developments frame MakeCity's citywide conversation. We'll look at concepts for a new social contract for cities. We'll showcase innovation on many levels: material, process-based, in architecture and landscape urbanism. As a resolutely trans-disciplinary partnership of architects, urban planners, designers and civic groups – the MakeCity festival is co-designed! The result: over 250 events to discover and spaces to explore throughout the city: from exhibitions, workshops and excursions; in cultural centres, new architecture, studios, production and maker spaces.
